Parents Praise Proven Peckham Primary A reminder of this key message

The school is thrilled to share the outcome of the recent annual Parents Survey for its support and praise for the efforts of the school staff and leadership in meeting the parent/carer definition of what makes you 'satisfied' with your children's school. Stopping to reflect back we can remind parents that at the end of 2016, only 52% supported this statement—your school rating a massive 37% below national averages for answering this statement. By the end of 2017 77% of you supported this statement—a great improvement but still 12% below what parents of other children said about their school. But in 2018, just two years after the school began their #exceptionaleveryday offer, the school has risen to be above national averages for parent/carer satisfaction with their child's school. Wow! That's truly exceptional!




Black History Competition Winners on school trip:

1. Emergency Contact Form Completion
