This time it is about Camelot and plans for our school linked to the changes in our local area. As many of you will be aware, Camelot School sits at the very heart of the planned Old Kent Road regeneration area (within 800 metres of the planned Old Kent Road No. 2 Bakerloo station).



As many parents/carers may have seen a consultation notice has been posted on the school's front gate to propose that the school varies its pupil roll to be a two form entry school going forward. The section of this formal notice referring to your feedback is included here

The future for our local area and for our school is both exciting and positive but to secure that future we need to adapt our school to the impact on us in the short term.

Your views on this proposal are important to us.

The Local Authority wants to hear the views of everyone who feels they might be affected by this proposed reduction to the Published Admission Number and therefore we are consulting with parents, carers, governors, local councillors and other stakeholders. We will collate and present all feedback from this consultation to the Cabinet of the Council in January 2019 for decision, and if agreed, will then approach the Office of the Schools Adjudicator (OSA) for approval to amend the PAN of the school with effect from September 2019 thereafter.

Camelot Christmas Fair


