More quotes from our recent Ofsted trained inspectors visit

Last month, the school booked a 'one year on' audit of the standards of education and quality of teaching at Camelot. In addition to last newsletter comments, the auditors said:

"Assessment processes and the collection and analysis of data are now secure, providing a firm basis for teachers to plan appropriate lessons" "Provision for the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of pupils is good resulting in most pupils considering the fundamentals of British values as they make their decisions day by day. This has also enabled a significant improvement in pupils' behaviour throughout the day"

"…there are now no significant limitations on how good the school can become."

"Pupils' personal development is good; they feel safe and well supported. Pupils value their school for both the academic and personal / emotional support they receive. They speak highly of their teachers and the head teacher."

"Staff are very positive and are eager to do as much for their pupils as they possibly can. This bodes well for the next stages of staff development." "The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is excellent and children in Nursery and Reception make very good progress. All children observed were fully involved in activities, socialising very well and clearly very happy."
