One Year on & Ofsted trained inspectors visit again

Last week, the school booked a one year on audit of the standards of education and quality of teaching at Camelot. The auditors found the following:

“There is strong evidence that very hard work has resulted in the school turning a corner and being on a trajectory to success.”

“The headteacher and largely new staff team were set an enormous challenge by the difficulties the school went through over a number of years and the lack of stable leadership.

They are to be congratulated on the distance already travelled down the long road to recovery.”

“...there are now no significant limitations on how good the school can become.”

“The senior leadership of the school is excellent. The range of issues we identified had all been previously identified by the SLT, prioritised, remedial actions planned and the necessary development programs put in place.”

Very significantly most pupils’ behaviour for learning – their attitudes to learning, their relationships with staff and each other, their cooperation and motivation in lessons – is good.

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is excellent and children in Nursery and Reception make very good progress. All children observed were fully involved in activities, socialising very well and clearly very happy.

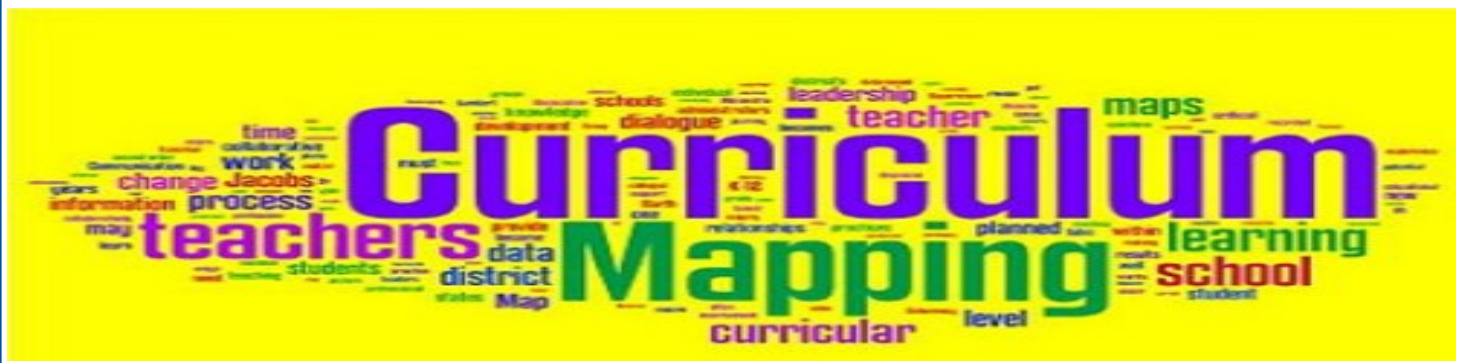

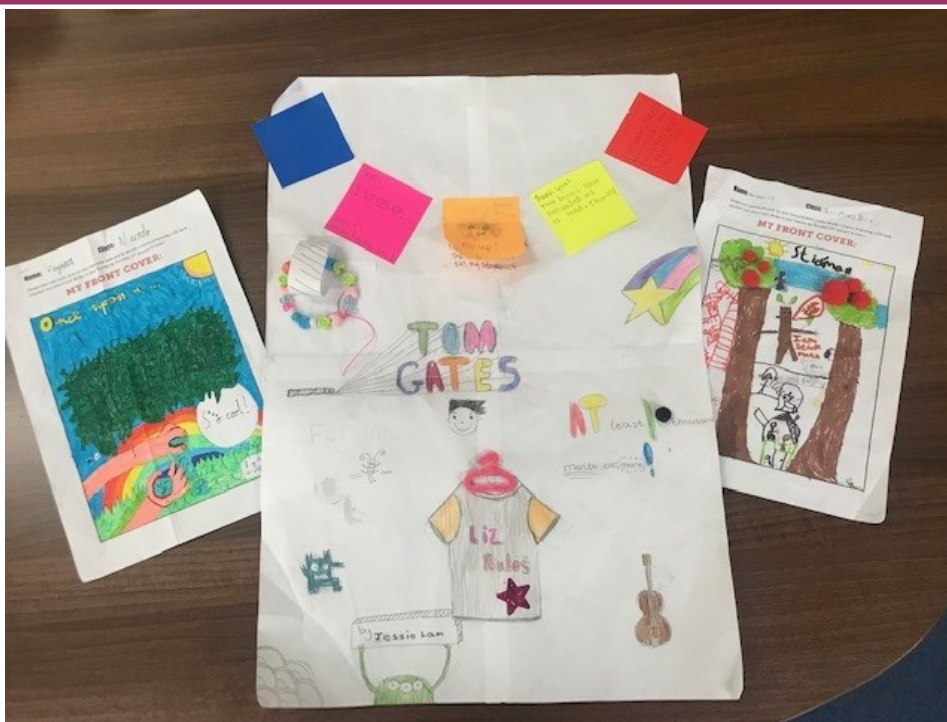

When? Saturdays, 10am–12noon.

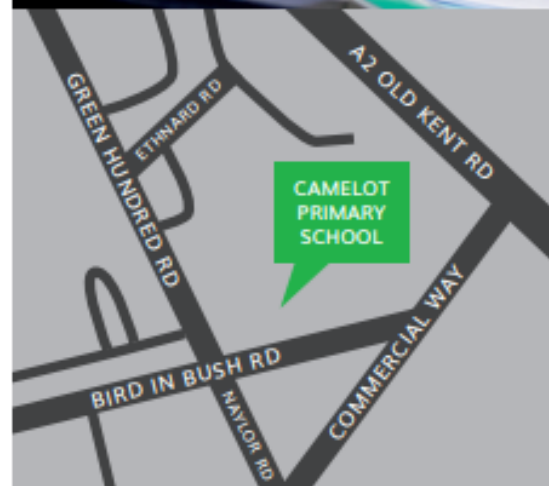
How much? £5.
