Born in Beirut to a Palestinian family, Mona Hatoum settled in England in 1975. Her work creates a challenging vision of our world, exposing its contradictions and complexities, often making the familiar uncanny. Through the juvtaposition of opposites such as beauty a horror, she engages us in conflicting emotions of desire and rerutsion, fear and fascination.

## **New After School Provision**



For 2020, before the school can relaunch a new after school provision, our After School Club will be run at our neighbouring school, St Francis School, accessed further along Bird in Bush Road. There will be a 'Walking Bus' (staff supervision of children to the club) that will take Camelot children both at 3.30 p.m. and after clubs finish at 4.15 p.m. as well as a reduced charging system to support parents/carers only requiring shorter hours provision.

## **Additional charges for 2020**

Please note that the school will be required to implement new charges for the following from January 2020 as there is now no additional school funding to support these areas of school life:

<u>Breakfast club provision</u> (from 7.45—8.45 a.m. every day) - £4 a day

<u>After School clubs</u> (from 3.30—4.15 p.m. across the week) - a charge of £2 a club

will be charged (support available—please speak to Miss Lou)
