Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie voted Women's prize 'winner of winners'

Nigerian author's novel Half of a Yellow Sun, which won in 2007, named the best book in the prize's 25-year history by the public



Thirteen years after she won the Women's prize for fiction, Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie's novel about the Biafran war, Half of a Yellow Sun, has been voted the "winner of winners" of the literary award in a public vote.

The one-off prize, to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the award, was judged by members of the public, who were asked to name their favourite of the 25 winners. Adichie's novel, which follows the lives of several characters caught up in the civil war in Nigeria in the late 1960s, beat titles including Zadie Smith's On Beauty and Lionel Shriver's We Need to Talk About Kevin. More than 8,500 people voted, according to the prize.

Recommended Read for Parents and Carers and as voted for by Mr Robinson as one the best fiction books he has read in recent years.

Embarassingly, Mr Robinson never knew of the suffering and bloodshed of the Biafran War until he had read 'Half of a Yellow Sun'

"End child food poverty – no child should be going hungry".

The Government responded as follows:

"We thank Marcus Rashford for highlighting the challenges facing families. On 8th November, the Government announced a comprehensive support package to help families through winter and beyond through the new Covid Winter Support grant, increasing the value of Healthy Start Vouchers and the national rollout of the Holiday Activities and Food programme for the longer holidays in 2021.

With Christmas coming, we want to give disadvantaged families peace of mind and help those who need it to have food on the table and other essentials so every child will be warm and well-fed this winter.

Through the Covid Winter Grant Scheme, we are delivering £170 million to local authorities in England starting in December to cover a period until the end of March. This fund builds on the £63 million already distributed earlier this year. This will allow councils to directly help the hardest-hit families and individuals, as well as provide food for children who need it over the holidays. Local councils understand which groups need support, and are best placed to ensure appropriate support is provided — which is why they will distribute the funds, rather than schools, who will continue providing meals for disadvantaged children during term-time.....

The Government went on to say that they will:

"Expand free school meals to all under-16s where a parent or guardian is in receipt of Universal Credit or equivalent benefit and provide meals & activities during all holidays.. (and to support) thousands of young people through our summer Holiday Activities and Food programme, operating for the third year running. This will be expanded across England next year. It will cover Easter, Summer and Christmas in 2021, and cost up to £220 million.

It is hoped all this support will be applied to families entitled to Pupil Premium Support (Free School Meals) as well where your family may be No Recourse to Public Funds. Please ensure your family have applied for support.
