### Some 'other' things matter to us exceptionally


"I am very pleased to inform you that your teams have won "Fair Play" awards this season. Your school will receive a "Fair Play" trophy to keep and your players each gets a certificate which your school can individually fill out for each one of your players. Each certificate has the FIFA Fair Play Code printed on the back. Encourage your children to read the code and help them to understand it.
