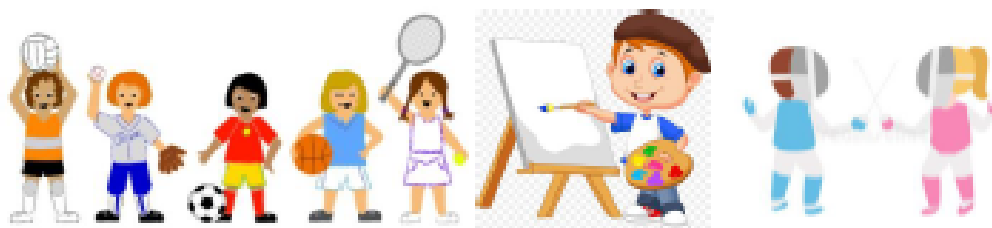


After many years of exceptional After School Provision led by Miss Denise and the school, the decision has been taken to invite an outside provider to run this provision from September 2018 onwards.

### Some 'other' things matter to us exceptionally

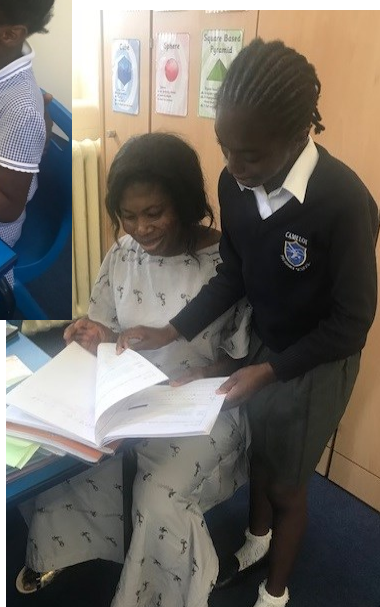
