London Marathon—Sunday morning 23rd April

Mr Robinson is running the London Marathon this Sunday and raising money for a Springboard Reading Hub to be provided for our community on Saturdays and to be based at Camelot School. Thank you to a whole host of children, parents, staff and governors for their sponsorship to date and we are pleased to confirm a local charity has offered to double every £ that can be raised for the Springboard work at Camelot School. If you are able to sponsor Mr Robinson's marathon please search for James Robinson on the Virgin Money Giving site.

If you are able to support the marathon, the best place to watch locally are as follows and as show on the map overleaf (with Mr.R's expected time to pass these points in brackets):

- 1. along Evelyn Street and near Deptford Park (between 11.10 11.20 a.m.)
- 2. along Lower Road, from the McDonalds and up to the Surrey Quays Shopping Centre (between 11.15 11.30 a.m.)
- 3. anywhere from Surrey Quays, around Rotherhithe and up to Rotherhithe station (between 11.20 11.45 a.m.)
- along Jamaica road, starting from the top of Southwark Park and through Bermondsey (between 11.30 – 11.50 a.m.)

If you see Mr Robinson, shout 'Go Camelot' which will be our special code so he can give you a wave back. If you have not been to the London Marathon it is a wonderful event to watch but with so many runners you need a special code for the runners to know you are there supporting. Mr Robinson will be running in an orange running shirt that he will be wearing at the end of school on Friday to show you all.


London Marathon Course Map
