Email Addresses: Please ensure you have an email address that we can use for letters and communication. No email address means that you will miss key messages from school.




Year 1 meet the local wildlife!

Springboard for Children believe every child should have a fair chance of future success, which is why they deliver high-quality, one-to-one tuition for disadvantaged children and young people across several inner-city schools including those in Southwark and Lambeth.

Springboard's literacy programmes have a huge impact on children's lives. By ensuring they are able to speak, read, write and listen to the level they need, Springboard reduces literacy failure in schools while drastically improving the life chances for children and young people who have nowhere else to turn.

In 2015/16 Springboard supported over **600 children** at risk of falling through the education system by narrowing their literacy gap from, on average, 24 months to less than 6 months.

By running the London Marathon in 2017 Mr Robinson wants to raise £5,000! This will go a very long way towards launching a new and exciting Community Learning Scheme that will give the children of Camelot School access to literacy support outside of school hours.
