Parents Praise Proven Peckham Primary

The school is thrilled to share the outcome of the recent annual Parents Survey for its support and praise for the efforts of the school staff and leadership in meeting the parent/carer definition of what makes you 'satisfied' with your children's school. We appreciate there is such a long way to go in securing everything a parent/carer would want for their child but in answer to the survey statement, "overall, I am happy with my child's school", this year 95% answered you were.*

Stopping to reflect back we can remind parents that at the end of 2016, only 52% supported this statement—your school rating a massive 37% below national averages for answering this statement. By the end of 2017 77% of you supported this statement—a great improvement but still 12% below what parents of other children said about their school. But in 2018, just two years after the school began their #exceptionaleveryday offer, the school has risen to be above national averages for parent/carer satisfaction with their child's school. Wow! That's truly exceptional!

Then the school's 2018 result was received this week. 95% of parents support the school which is 6% above national averages. This is an amazing result for the school—highlighting that parents/carers clearly recognise the trajectory of the school—elsewhere in the survey noting that further improvements are still needed but accepting that the efforts being made to improve the school are noted and praised. Pleasingly, in addition, 93% of parents/carers answered positively to whether they agreed that their child was happy at school—again above national averages and again huge praise for the school. Thank you parents/carers and well done everyone for the efforts being made to do the right thing for the children at Camelot School, SE15—exceptionaleveryday and one of Peckham's proven primary schools.

1. Emergency Contact Form Completion
