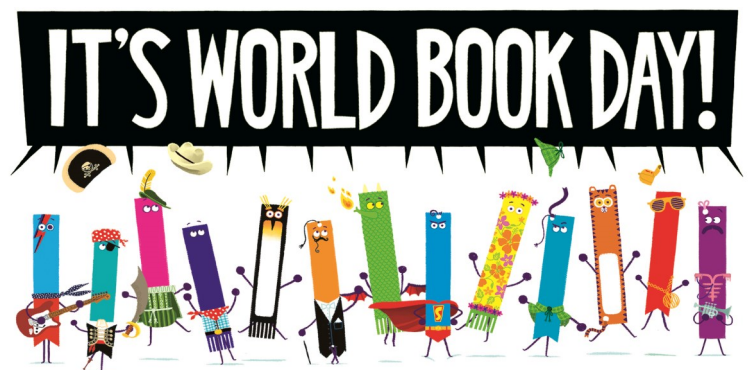
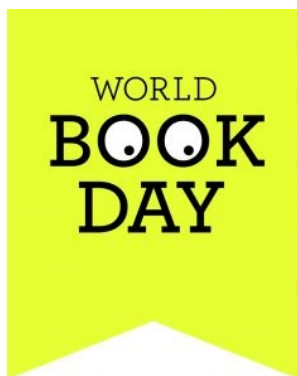


Exceptional Teaching and Learning at Camelot Primary School

– a selection of our aims for our school

- Teachers demonstrate deep knowledge and understanding of the subjects they teach. As a result, they plan sequences of learning which progressively build on pupil's knowledge and skill.
- Teachers have a clear understanding of the pupil's learning journey across all subject areas. They plan units of work which will provide challenge and support for all.
- Teachers use assessment to help pupils embed and use knowledge fluently, develop their understanding, and not simply memorise disconnected facts.
- Teachers enable pupils to understand key concepts, presenting information clearly and promoting appropriate discussion.
- Pupils are given the opportunity to embed key concepts in their long-term memory and apply them fluently. Pieces of knowledge across the curriculum are sequenced so that new knowledge and skills build on what has been taught before and towards defined end points.

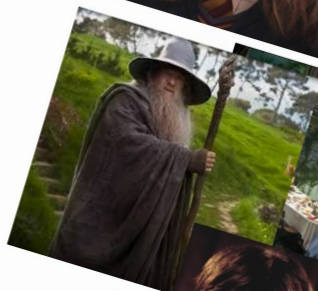

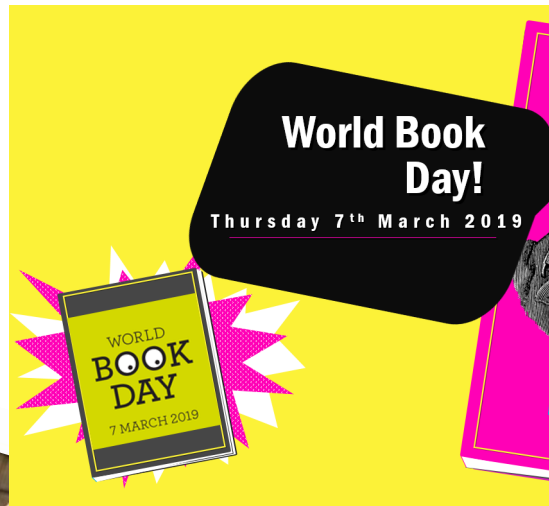

When? Saturdays, 10am–12noon.

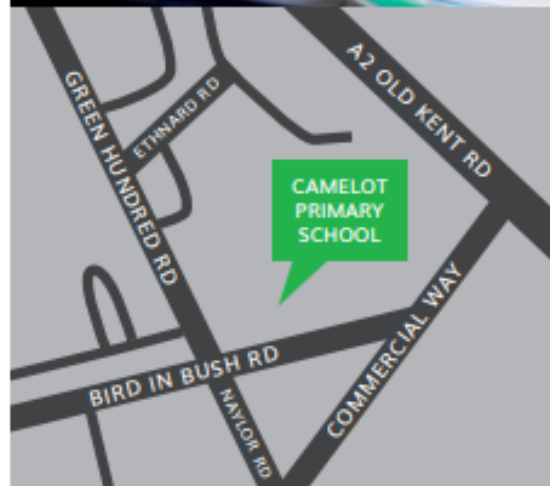
How much? £5.
