Why? Because we believe that every child deserves the best possible education every day and with the support of exceptional staff and parents/carers we believe we can do it.



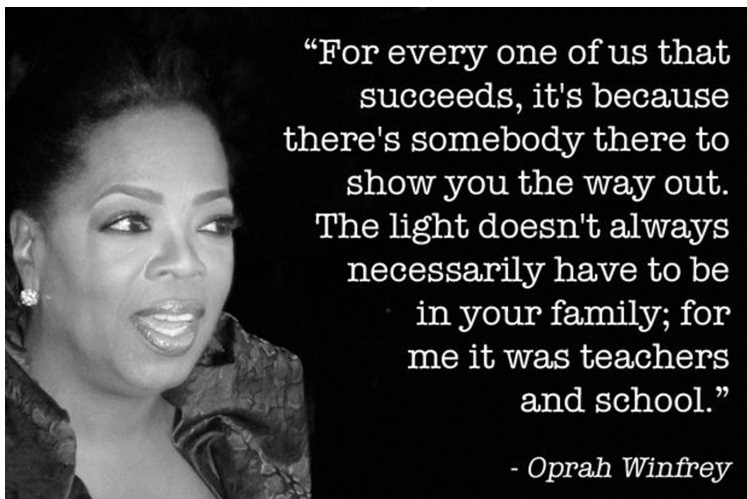

SRE guidance for parents

(Sex and Relationships Education)

Every year, primary schools in our country are required to support our children's education and understanding on a wide range of subjects. One subject that we are introducing this term is SRE— a subject that introduce different aged children to different age appropriate themes about growing up. For example, the following are some of the themes your children may be following this term:

- ⇒ In Reception—Our lives (Our day; Keeping ourselves clean, families)
- ⇒ In Year 1—Growing and caring for ourselves (Keeping clean, growing and changing and families and care)
- ⇒ In Year 2—Differences (Boys and Girls; Male and Female; Naming the body parts)
- ⇒ In Year 3—Valuing difference and keeping safe (Male and Female; Personal space; family differences)
- ⇒ In Year 4—Growing up (Growing and changing; What is puberty?; Puberty changes and reproduction)
- ⇒ In Year 5—Puberty (Talking about puberty; Male and Female changes; Puberty and hygiene)
- ⇒ In Year 6—Puberty, Relationships and Reproduction (Understanding relationships; Conception and pregnancy; Communication in relationships)

Please note the school nurse will lead on a number of the lessons across Year 5 and 6.

Meeting Someone Special Year 3 Style!

Adedoyin Adepitan. Or Ade to his friends and the public, was born in Lagos Nigeria. At the age of fifteen months he contracted Poliomyelitis. The effects of the virus meant that Ade was unable to use his left leg, and only had partial use of his right leg.

In 1976 when Ade was three years old. His parents decided move to the UK where it would be easier to bring up a child with a disability. They settled in London.

Moving to the UK was one of the most important events in his life. He was taught how to walk using iron calipers, which he wore until the age of 17. Despite having Polio, Ade loved playing football with his school friends. He spent his early years dreaming of playing football for England.

After turning down an opportunity to study and play basketball, at the University in Chicago, Ade decided to play basketball professionally for two years. His dream to play for Great Britain at the Paralympics finally came true. After fifteen years, Ade was selected to compete in the Sydney 2000 Paralympics.
