Camelot School Parents Survey Outcomes 2019

Question	Strongly Agree or Agree	Strongly Disagree or Disagree
I know how my child is getting on at school	99%	0%
My child is progressing well at this school	99%	0%
My child is happy at school	99%	0%
My child is given too much homework	10%	89%
The school looks after my child	98%	1%
If I raised a concern I feel confident my child's school would respond well	97%	1%
The school's senior leaders do a good job (Head, Deputies, SENCo)	98%	1%
Overall, I am satisfied with my child's school	99.5%	0.5% (1 no comment)
I would recommend my child's school to other parents/carers	99%	0%

If percentages do not add up to 100% this is because a parent/carers believed they did not feel able to answer the question

Over 100 Parents/Carers responded to the annual survey – our best turnout in recent years (overall satisfaction scores for recent years: 2016 – 52%; 2017 – 96%; 2018 – 97% and now 2019 – 99%)

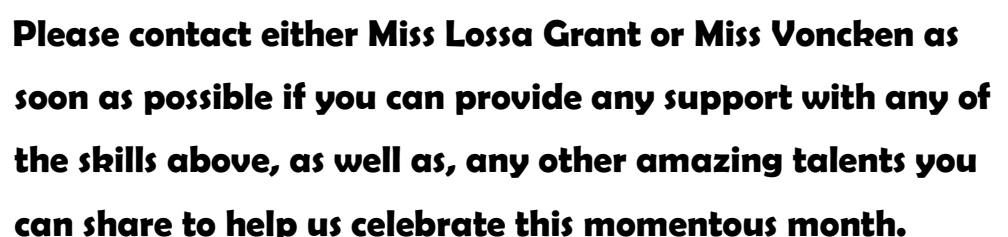
