A message from the leaders of Southwark Council at this time

Re: COVID-19 Testing Update

The number of cases of Covid-19 are rising in the borough, particularly in 12-17 year olds and young adults. Your child and the people they live with can now get at test at our testing centres even if they do not have any symptoms.

There are several testing centres available in and near to Southwark, including in Burgess Park and in Peckham town centre. To book a test please visit https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test and select the 'my council has asked me to get a test' option. The website will show you the nearest site to you with availability that day.

If your child's, or another member of your household's, test comes back positive your child and your household must self-isolate for a full 10 days after the date the test was done.

Getting tested is one of the most important things you can do to keep yourself and others safe this winter, so please do take up this offer. If you decide not to get to a test, but you or someone you live with develops symptoms, you must all self-isolate and the person who is unwell should book a test. If the test comes back as positive they and the people they live with should self-isolate for a full 10 days after the day they became unwell.

Christmas Holidays

COVID-19 is spreading quickly again in Southwark and London. We all need to play our part in stopping the virus, so together we can protect our families, friends and neighbours, and prevent more people dying this Christmas and New Year.

The number of people testing positive in Southwark has increased by 71% over the last 7 days, the fastest increase since April.

To keep us all safe Christmas will need to be different. With infections rising so fast it is very important that we all take extra care so we don't catch or pass on the virus. Please:

- Think carefully about the best way to keep your friends and family safe.
 The new rules set strict limits on how you can meet, but many people will decide that it is safer not to meet at all and to catch up by phone or over the internet this Christmas and New Year.
- Think particularly carefully about meeting older or vulnerable relatives who are more likely to become seriously ill if they contract COVID-19.
- Avoid crowded places. If you do go out and about including for Christmas shopping – try to avoid places where you can't keep your distance from people.
- Wear a face covering. We all need to follow the rules on wearing them in indoor public places and on public transport but I also encourage you to wear one if you are in a busy outdoor space where you can't keep your distance
- Reduce the number of journeys you make wherever possible

Parent Governor Elections

In January 2021, the school will looking for a new Parent Governor to work alongside school leaders and governors to steer the school in these extraordinary times.

Who the role would suit:

 A parent/carer with time to attend meetings in the school day and in the evenings (approximately 10 meetings a year).

Availability to attend meetings can be more valuable than any particular expertise in school governance.

Should you possibly be interested in putting your name forward why not have a personal conversation with Mr Robinson who will be happy to answer any questions you may have.

Parent governors are at the heart of successful schools and Camelot really needs nominations from parents/carers who could support our determination to offer our children as an exceptional education that we can with the resources we have available to us.

A suggested gift for your children this Christmas time:

Your child is already in the process of becoming the kind of person he or she is eventually going to be. So to bring them up right and to make them proud of you, live by these six principles:

- 1) **Assure them of your love**. They need to know your love is given, and it will never be withdrawn because of their appearance, achievements, or actions. Let them know they are loved for who they are, and that their worth in your eyes is never in question.
- 2) **Build strong character and values**. It is said "Direct your children onto the right path, and when they are older, they will not leave it"
- 3) **Establish clear boundaries**. And be consistent in maintaining them. Do children like rules? No. But your first goal is not to make your child happy, it's to teach them responsibility, and happiness will follow.
- 4) **Help them to discover their potential**. That means listening, observing, and once their talents are identified, helping to develop them. It is said 'We have different gifts, according to the grace given us...'
- 5) **Don't try to duplicate yourself through them**. Each child has their own unique makeup and personality. Don't try to make them something that the rest of us don't need one more of!
- 6) **Encourage them to pursue their life's vision**. Don't pour cold water on the fire of their enthusiasm, fan it. Get out of the critic's seat and become their greatest supporter. If you do, you will make them proud of you.

Camelot in Lockdown

What we have learned?

 When in a period of self isolation or lockdown children may need a laptop to access their daily educational entitlement

School Response: The school will provide any child in a period of self isolation with a laptop for this period

• The school's online education in a period of isolation requires a reliable internet source for every child working at home

School Response: The school will provide any family without a reliable internet source with a school dongle and a free SIM to provide sufficient data for any period of isolation (the data is for the Google Classroom access and will not be sufficient for free use or playing games)

 Working at home is not as good as being in school with friends, with direct teacher instruction and free school dinners

School Response: The school will provide a £15 voucher to every child entitled to Free School Meals to cover any period of self isolation (as the government will do for a period of lockdown*)

The expectation is that every child attends their online Classroom for every day of any period of self isolation. Self isolation school remains compulsory and the school is required to account for all children during any such period and report any daily absences.

Reminder * Have you registered your child for receiving FSM support for the holidays ahead. Registration entitles your family to receive £30 of government food voucher for each child in your family.
