### MR ROBINSON: THE WIZARD OF CAMELOT

PECKHAM'S CAMELOT school is now rated 'good' by Ofsted, with particular praise handed out to the 'inspirational' head teacher who helped turn the school around.

In 2016, Ofsted had said the school 'required improvement', citing staff turnover and changes in leadership among the primary school's weaknesses.

But after an inspection in February inspectors rated it as 'good' in every area.

The report highlights that head teacher James Robinson, and his leadership team, had 'created an ethos of high expectations and aspirations that pupils understand and value'.

Pupils were noted for their politeness and being proud of their

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work, having a positive attitude to learning and responding well to teacher support.
