



The Constance Bevis New Library Book Appeal

In March 2021, Camelot School lost the generosity and support of our No.1 volunteer and librarian, Constance Bevis, who recently passed away. We wanted to mark her contributions to our school in a way that we know she would have loved.... namely to seek to ensure there are more books available in our school library for our children.

To do this we are writing to charities, education supporting and book loving organisations and individuals to request donations to this appeal. The list of books we are seeking to purchase are shared overleaf and in many cases we are looking to buy multiple copies of the most popular titles.

Camelot Primary School is on the Old Kent Road, in North Peckham in London and is home to approximately 400 pupils. Currently, over 52% of the pupils are entitled to additional support through Free School Meals/Early Years Pupil Premium or as their parents/carers are at No Recourse to Public Funds. The school faces many challenges on its budget at this time but will match fund any donation up to our appeal target of £5000 for new books.

Constance loved her twice weekly interactions with our pupils, always patiently guiding them in their choice of new library books to choose and take home to read. Next time they visited, she ensured they returned the book with her eager eye for high standards in our library! Without her we have lost our best solution to running a school library as in these times we can no longer afford to employ a librarian of our own.

“Southwark remains committed to supporting its disadvantaged and vulnerable pupils and will do this by using the Winter Grant Scheme funding to provide meals for those pupils who are eligible to receive benefits-related FSM during the Easter holiday in April 2021. In addition, funding will also be provided for meals, over the same period, for any primary and nursery pupils whose parent requests them, in line with the council’s FHSNM pledge.”

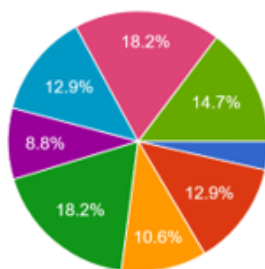
Key Highlights include 170 responses—up from 106 in 2021 and 76 in 2020

What year group is your child in?

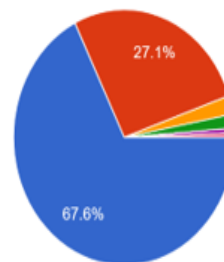

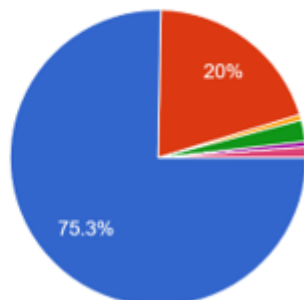

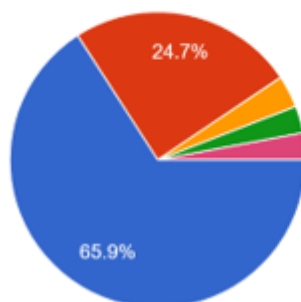

Books back from Lockdown

In March 2020 in response to the rush of the first Lockdown, teachers were instructed to send every child home with multiple reading books. The school now finds key gaps in our book libraries across the school and will have to dedicate many hundreds of pounds to restore these libraries back to the pre March 2020 standards. After School Clubs are restarting... slowly!



Current restrictions mean that no indoor activities in school can include children from more than one year group. From April, the plan is that Year 2 and Year 3 will be one group as will Year 4 and Year 5. These year groups currently share floors in school.



An exceptional Year 6 Art club has joined the after school football clubs as restarting at this time... and many more clubs are planned subject to changes in guidance regarding social distancing and bubbles. At this time, all after school clubs will be free to join and we look forward to sharing more details soon. All volunteers to run these clubs are welcomed.
