*** Please note that should places be limited for planned Summer CHAMPS this July and August then our funding criteria recommends prioritising FSM and NRPF pupils for places.**



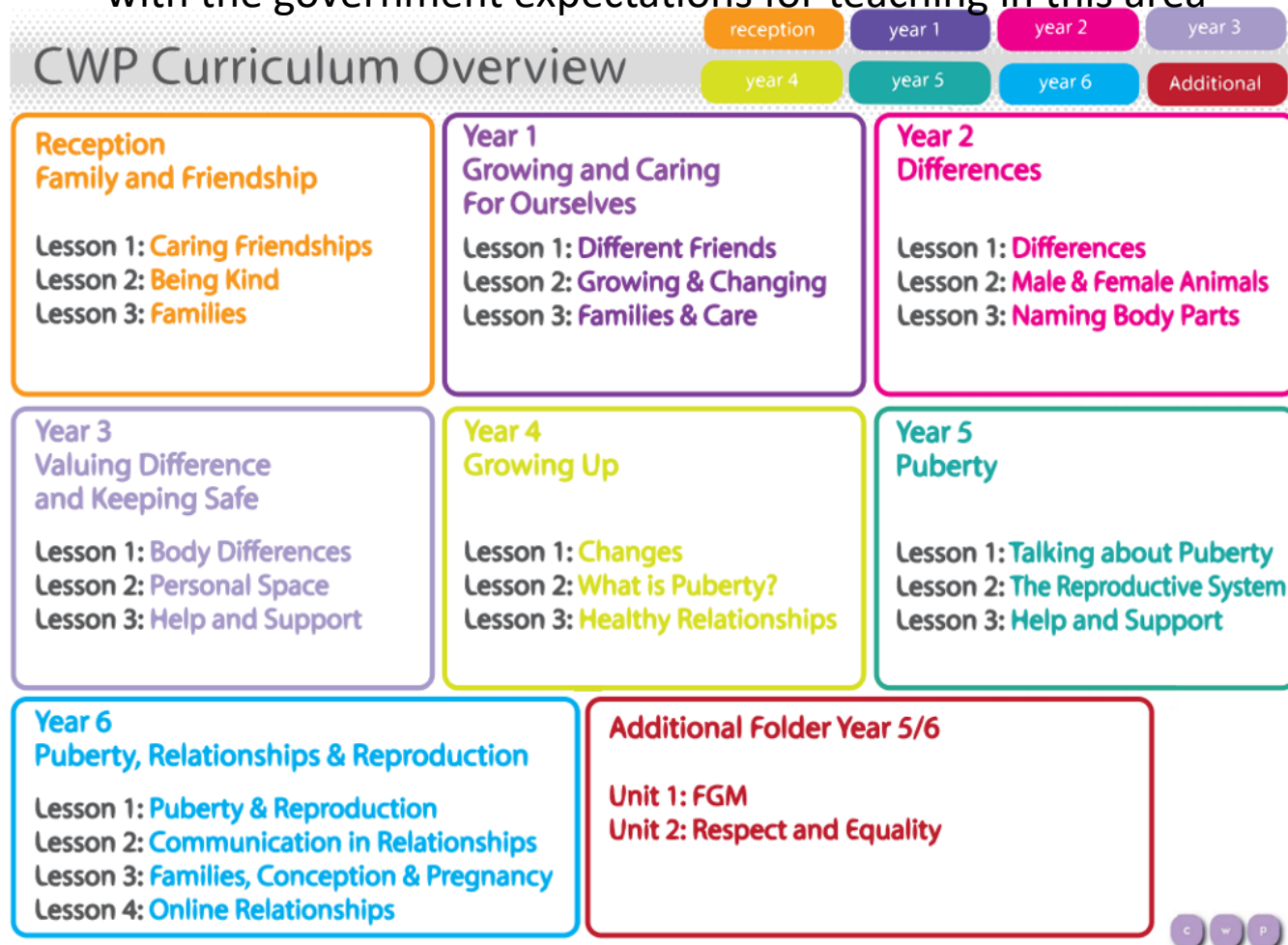
School visits are back on and there are plans for many more!
