## **School and Parents Forum Meeting No.2**

In response to the school's focus on developing a fully inclusive, racially literate curriculum offer to our children, Ms Lossa Grant and Miss Voncken hosted a 2nd meeting to canvas parent/carer involvement in developing practice in this area

### What is Racial Literacy?

A focus on how both current and historical racism shapes children's educational, social, economic and political experiences WHAT IS RACIAL LITERACY? WHY DO WE NEED RACIAL LITERACY?

 Racial Literacy focuses how both <u>current and historical</u> racism shape children's educational, social economic, political experiences.

 In other words understanding the history of racism helps us to understand how to start to address the effects it has on Camelot children, and how to adjust our practice to ensure we become racially literate educators.
