For some a sense of belonging was linked to socioeconomic solidarity, pride in the industrial and working-class history of the area, and its role as a gateway to London for newly arrived migrants." (p.50)

"The largest concern overall amongst residents, stakeholders and traders was the lack of activities, spaces and education and employment opportunities for young people. "If you live on an estate in a place like Southwark you don't get many chances in life, and if you miss the ones that you get, you're in trouble. Creating those opportunities is what needs to be the focus ... and education." (Stakeholder) (p.59)


