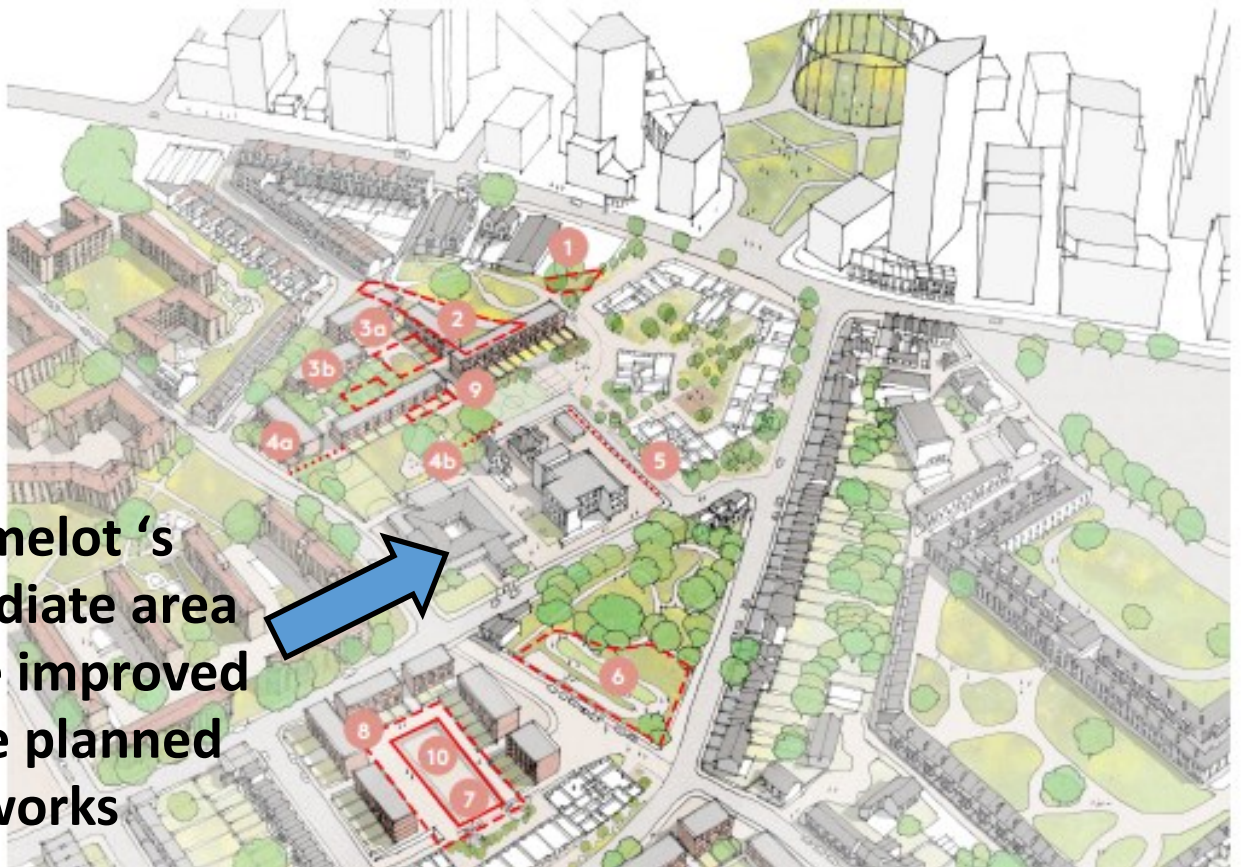

Potential projects

- 1 Potential conversion of the dog walking area into parking
- 2 Pencraig Way surface marking to highlight continuation of traffic calming measures and additional parking
- 3a + 3b Windpoint Drive Allotments growing space / planters
- 4a Reduce height of brickwork wall along school boundary to +600mm & replace chainlink fence to playground
- 4b Remove brickwork wall on Arthur Street
- 5 Remove metalwork fence and make good victorian boundary wall & add new mural along school boundary
- 6 BMX track to be resurfaced
- 7 New planters and growing space within the courtyard
- 8 Resurfacing of Bramyard courtyards / making good of existing concrete pavers
- 9 Construct new brickwork garden wall and paved terrace for ground floor Windpoint Drive maisonettes
- 10 Southwark Council will be refurbishing the basement garages at the Bramyard site, which will provide around 90 parking spaces on completion of the homes for residents with the right to return. Further information about these works will be provided in due course



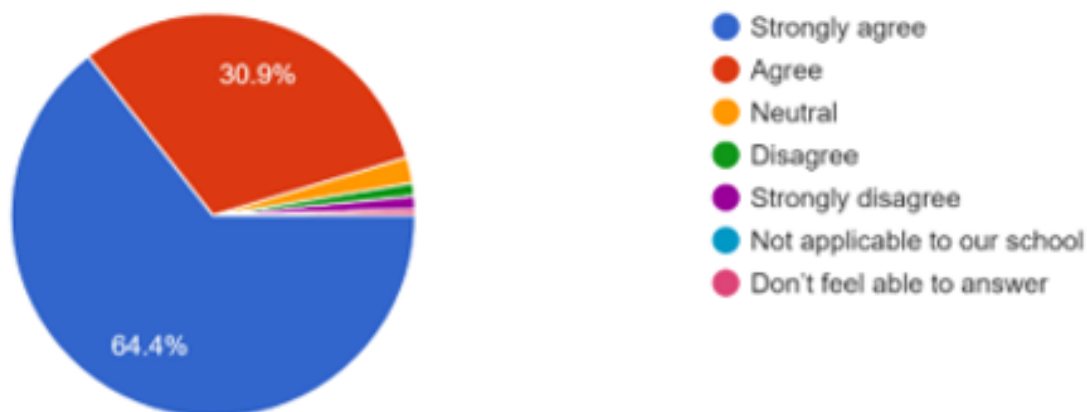

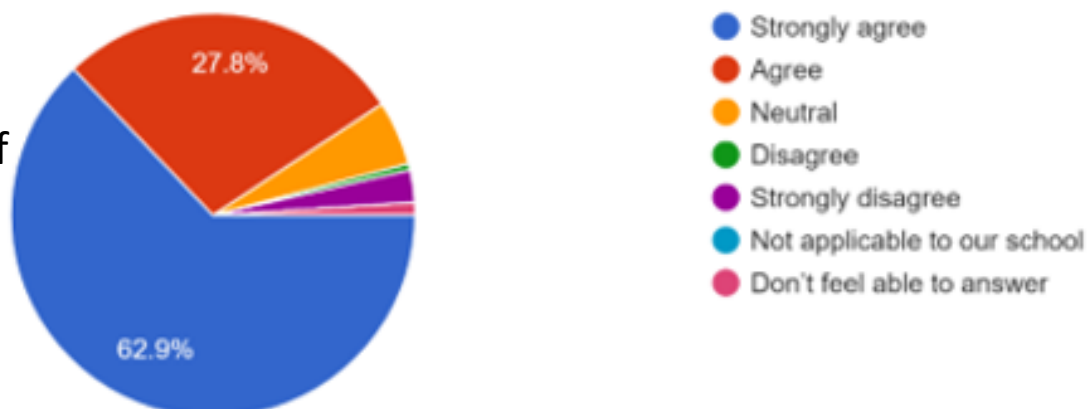

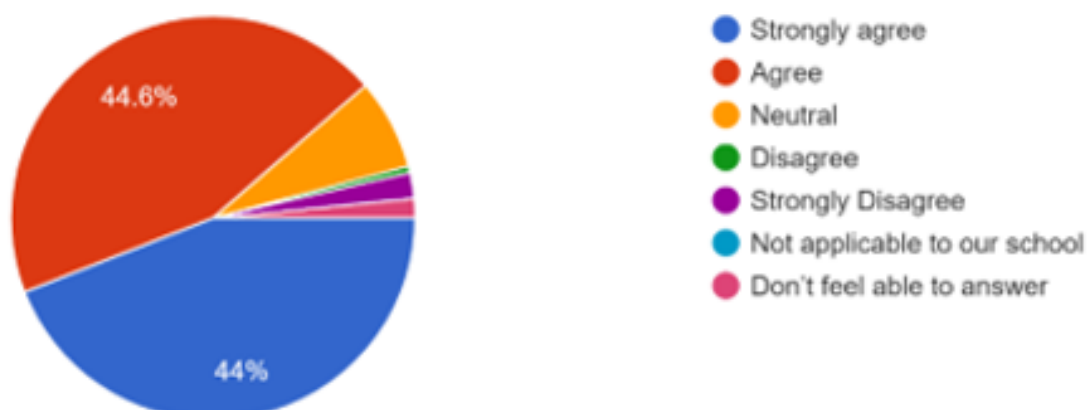

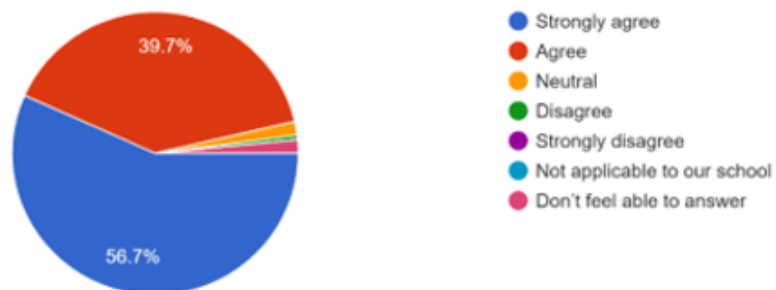


The Camelot School Annual Parent Survey

The school's priority plans are influenced by this feedback.

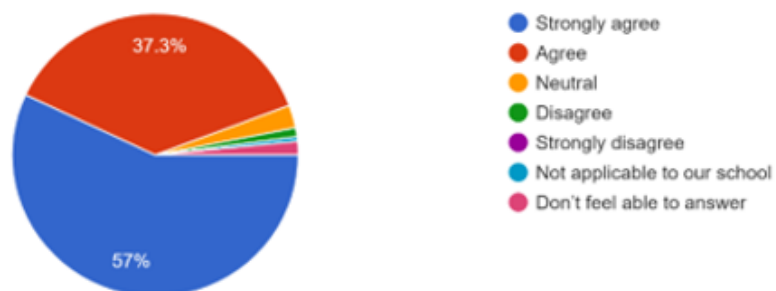
My child is happy at school and I have necessary feedback from the school?

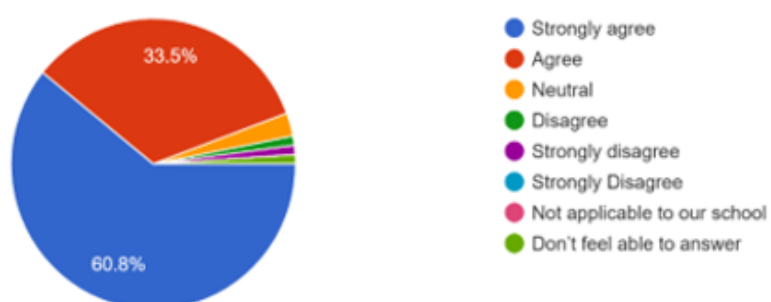
My child is progressing well at this school – even after all the time in lockdown

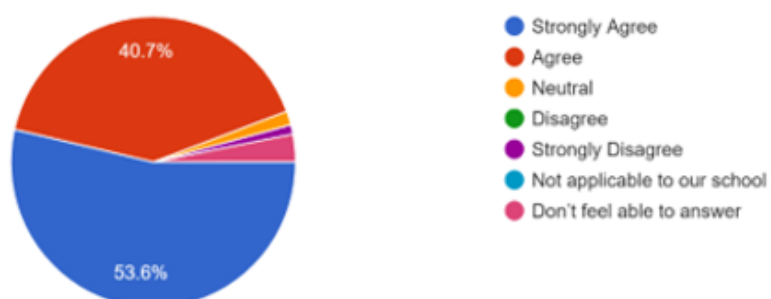
The school looks after my child and provides a safe environment for them

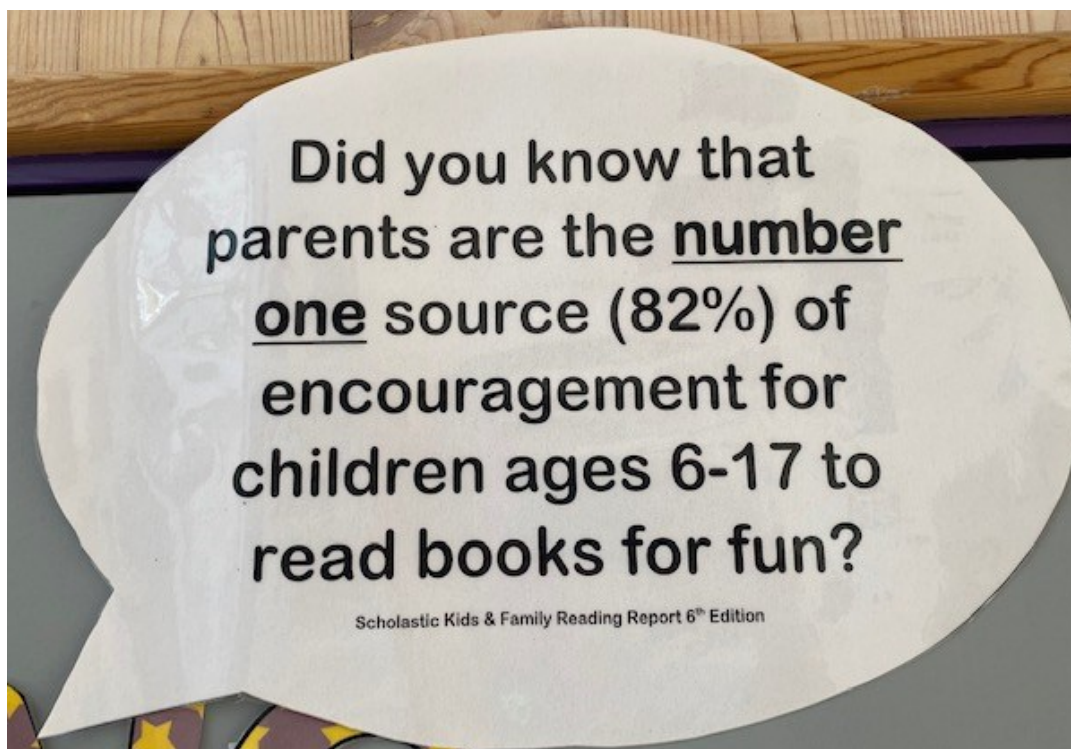

	Desserts, cakes and biscuits are allowed at lunchtime. They must not contain any confectionery			
	Salt must not be available to add to food after it has been cooked			
	Any condiments limited to sachets or portions of no more than 10 grams or one teaspoonful.			
HEALTHIER DRINKS <i>applies across the whole school day</i>	Free, fresh drinking water at all times			
	The only drinks permitted are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plain water (still or carbonated) • Lower fat milk or lactose reduced milk • Fruit or vegetable juice (max 150mls) • Plain soya, rice or oat drinks enriched with calcium; plain fermented milk (e.g. yoghurt) drinks • Unsweetened combinations of fruit or vegetable juice with plain water (still or carbonated) • Combinations of fruit juice and lower fat milk or plain yoghurt, plain soya, rice or oat drinks enriched with calcium; cocoa and lower fat milk; flavoured lower fat milk • Tea, coffee, hot chocolate Combination drinks are limited to a portion size of 330mls. They may contain added vitamins or minerals, but no more than 5% added sugars or honey or 150mls fruit juice. Fruit juice combination drinks must be at least 45% fruit juice			

Every meal at Camelot meets the National Food Standards and our Flagship status is given to our school as an acknowledgment of the quality of lunches served to our children every day.

It is expected that schools will use these checklists in combination with the nutrition criteria of the Government Buying Standards for Food and Catering Services.
