## Daily School Attendance is essential.... and expected

It is important to note it is essential for pupils to attend school to get the most out of their school experience, noting the impact on their attainment, wellbeing, wider life chances. The pupils with the highest attainment at the end of Key Stage 2 have higher rates of attendance over the key stage compared to those with the lowest attainment. Generally, any pupil attending more than 95% is far more likely to achieve or exceed targets set based on prior achievements and potential.

At Camelot, we are proud of our pupil attendance which is regularly above the national average and we need to all work together to sustain this. Whilst we understand the impact Covid has been having, we need to ensure that this impact is not extended by allowing any potential small symptoms, such as colds or tiredness to prevent students from attending school. We are grateful to the many parents/carers who understand this, and who do their best to arrange any medical appointment to have the least possible impact on time spent in school.

We also extend our thanks to all those parents/carers who let us know of any absence by 8.45am of the morning of absence, and to help clear up any queries that may affect daily attendance and plans for your child's education.

Holiday Free School Meals - February half term 2023
Again, Southwark Council are supporting all families entitled to additional holiday food vouchers (note other councils have begun to remove this support and Southwark may have this funding removed going forward).
This funding is for all children entitled to Free School Meals (FSM) support (Nursery to Year 6) and if your family is entitled to No Recourse to Public Funding (NRPF) support. Please do claim this £15 per child half term support—over 50% of the Camelot community are already benefiting.
