How to apply

Applying online

If you get Universal Credit, you can apply online if:

- you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have at least one child under 4 years old
- your family's monthly 'take-home pay' (also called 'earned income') is £408 or less from employment

Universal Credit claimants

To be paid correctly for all of your children, make sure that each child is named on your Universal Credit claim.

Go to your <u>Universal Credit account (opens in a new tab)</u> to check this.
